

### PA Institute for Instructional Coaching (PIIC)

Instructional coaching has emerged as a promising strategy for increasing student achievement and affecting education reform nationwide. Extensive research suggests that teacher quality is the most significant factor affecting student achievement, and teachers who participate in quality professional development advances teaching skills, which can lead to improved student achievement (Alliance for Excellent Education, 2006).

Research also indicates that teachers who are supported by instructional coaches are more likely to implement newly learned instructional strategies with fidelity. PIIC's instructional coaching model provides support to enhance teacher quality with meaningful professional development tied to standards, curriculum, research, and best practices: follow-up support to effectively implement new learning; and scaffolding that encourages reflective practices and instruction. Instructional mentoring provides essential support for instructional coaches, schools, districts, and Intermediate Units across Pennsylvania. These include: One on one and group professional development; Evidentiary-based instructional strategies; Tools and resources; Analytical skills for improving programs and practices facilitation and communication skills.

#### Adaptive Physical Education

Adaptive physical education is adaptations and modifications, so students with a disability can participate in PE. Adaptive physical education develops the fundamental motor skills and patterns such as throwing, catching, walking, and running. In adaptive physical education class students can be at different skill levels. Being in an environment with a small group or even one on one service each student can spend the time they need to make strides in improving the basic fundamental motor skills. The class is slow-paced so that each student's needs are met by the adaptive physical education teacher. The Adaptive PE teacher will contribute to the IEP by writing PELs and goals.

## **Special Education - Assistive Technology**

#### **Assistive Technology Consultation (SETT)**

Assistive technology devices and services are those that provide access to the general education curriculum and/or a means to meet IEP goals. AT devices and services may be needed for alternative augmentative communication, computer access, written communication, environmental control, or for sensory (auditory or visual) access. AT may encompass both hi-tech and low-tech solutions and allows many students with disabilities to function effectively in the general education curriculum and to meet their educational goals.

Upon receiving a referral, the MIU IV AT consultants will gather data and guide the team through a decision making process called SETT (Student, Environments, Task, and Tools). The SETT process will lead the team in determining if and what AT supports are needed and put a plan in place for implementation.

Pennsylvania's BrainSTEPS (Strategies Teaching Educators, Parents, and Students) Brain Injury School Re-Entry Program has been designed to consult with school teams and families in the development and delivery of educational services for students who have experienced any type of acquired brain injury. BrainSTEPS is implemented through the Brain Injury Association of Pennsylvania to work with students who have sustained a new brain injury, as well as with students who have been previously identified as having a brain injury and who may begin to develop educational effects over the years as the brain matures and develops.

BrainSTEPS consultants provide training and consultation to school teams and families pertaining to:

- Identification and management of acquired brain injury symptoms within the school setting, utilizing accommodations and modifications
- · School re-entry planning
- IEP and 504 development
- Intervention selection and implementation
- Ongoing monitoring of students
- Student specific brain injury training for district teams
- LEA in-service training on all severities of acquired brain injuries and resulting educational impacts

## **Special Education - Community Based Vocational Training (CBVT)**

### Community Based Vocational Training (CBVT)

The Community Based Vocational Program opens new doors in various vocational areas for students with special needs. For many, this is their first introduction to the world of work. Students are matched to appropriate community based worksites for job training. Students work as volunteers one or more days a week, accompanied by a qualified staff member who remains on site. They are never left unsupervised but are encouraged to work independently. The staff member oversees the quality of all work and expands job responsibilities as students progress.

The CBVT Instructor provides an in-depth vocational assessment for each student in consultation with the work site. Students are evaluated by their assigned staff member at their work sites regarding work readiness and work performance skills. Transportation can be arranged by the IU or be provided by the school district. The goal of the CBVT program is to allow students exposure and experience in work settings that will help them make good decisions about their future employment.

- Employment preparation through vocational exploration, assessment and training that occurs in a real work setting. It is designed to move students with disabilities toward their goal of employment.
- Occurs in a typical work setting rather than in conventional school environments.
- Student participation is a non-paid, volunteer vocational experience.
- Students are evaluated, instructed and supervised by trained school district staff or community agency job specialists at real work sites in the community.
- Develop communication skills and self-advocacy skills
- To develop employment related social skills and increase the self-awareness of career interests and abilities.

## **Special Education - Extended School Year**

### **Extended School Year (ESY)**

Extended School Year (ESY) services are special education and related services provided to students with disabilities beyond the regular 180-day school year. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), the federal special education law, requires school districts, intermediate units, and charter schools to provide ESY services if a student needs these services to receive a free appropriate public education (FAPE). In some cases, interruptions in the school schedule, such as summer break, weekends, and holidays, will result in children with disabilities losing many of their basic skills and taking a long time to get those skills back once school begins again. ESY services are provided during breaks in the educational schedule to prevent this loss.

## **Special Education - Instruction in the Home**

## Instruction in the Home

Cost \$225 an hour Instruction Conducted in the Home is included in the definition of special education located in the federal regulations (34 CFR §300.39(a)(i)), and is recognized as a placement option on the continuum of alternative placements for students with disabilities (34 CFR §300.115). The use of Instruction Conducted in the Home is restricted to students whose needs require full-time special education services and programs outside of the school setting for the entire day. Instruction Conducted in the Home is a placement determined only by the decision of an individualized education program (IEP).

Homebound Instruction describes the instruction a local educational agency (LEA) may provide when a student has been excused from compulsory attendance under 22 Pa. Code §11.25 due to temporary mental or physical illness or other urgent reasons. Homebound Instruction applies to all students — general education students, as well as students who receive special education services. The purpose of Homebound Instruction is to keep the student on track academically while the student is temporarily out of school.

Homebound Instruction is not a special education placement option for students with disabilities, however, there are occasions when a student with a disability may receive homebound instruction due to a temporary excusal from compulsory attendance in the same manner as the student's nondisabled peers.

MIU IV can provide Instruction in the Home and Homebound Instruction for students with disabilities.

## **Special Education - Occupational Therapy**

### **Occupational Therapy**

Cost \$110 an hour

The provision of occupational therapy in the schools is based upon an educational model and not a medical model. Within the educational model, the therapists adhere to educational regulations. Medical authorization is not needed for OT. The therapist evaluates the child for functioning in the EDUCATION ENVIRONMENT. It is helpful to have information from the child's medical team, but that medical team does not determine the need for educational therapies.

Educational therapy is to increase the student's functioning and their ability to access the educational environment.

Occupational Therapies in the school environment focus on:

- Developing functional skills and adaptations that promote attainment of educational objectives
- Improving knowledge and skills of the family and educational staff regarding the educational impact of the student's disability on their educational program
- Maximizing the child's ability to execute functional tasks required at school and access adaptive equipment
- Enabling the child to participate in school activities and remain in the least restrictive environment
- Providing for the student's optimal freedom of movement and access in the school setting
- Facilitating the student's ability to respond to basic sensorimotor information as a foundation for the acquisition and development of motor skills and for the organization of attention and behavior
- Maintaining the child in the best position of stability to increase functional usage of hands and to optimize learning
- Communicating the student's skills to the educational team
- Improving the competency of educational staff in body mechanics, handling techniques, and motor skills
- Providing educationally based therapy activities both within and outside of the classroom

#### **Tier I MTSS Occupational Therapy Program**

This eight-week Tier I MTSS intervention program provided by the occupational therapist in the presence of the teacher is designed to prepare all students to be ready for handwriting success. Strategies are presented by the therapist in a manner that makes them easy to integrate into classroom activities and routines. During the thirty-minute activity, the therapist teaches the students and teacher why the strategy works and how it helps them have more legible handwriting. The program includes but is not limited to: seating posture, directionality, body awareness, crossing midline, hand dominance, sensory-motor development, developmental hand skills, grasping patterns, visual-motor development, and pre-writing strokes. The Screener of Handwriting Proficiency is utilized during final session to assess progress towards proficient handwriting.

### **FBA - Functional Behavior Assessments**

Functional Behavioral Assessment (FBA) is a process for identifying problem behaviors and developing interventions to improve or eliminate those behaviors. An FBA consists of information-gathering procedures that result in a hypothesis about the function(s) that the behavior is serving for the student. The process also results in the identification of environmental antecedents (what happened before the behavior occurred) and consequences (what happened after the behavior occurred) that are maintaining the behavior. The information gathered is used to develop an effective and efficient behavior plan.

The FBA process is frequently used to determine the nature and extent of the special education and related services that the child needs, including the need for a positive behavior support plan. As with other individualized evaluation procedures, and consistent with 34 CFR §300.300 (a) and (c), parental consent is required for an FBA to be conducted as part of the initial evaluation or a reevaluation.

#### **Social Emotional Learning Services**

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process through which children understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. SEL consists of 5 core competencies: self-awareness, self-management, responsible decision making, relationship skills, social-awareness. Social and Emotional Learning services not only improves behavior, but also increases academic achievement.

There are 3 tiers to our SEL services:

**Tier 1:** Large group whole class lessons for students 1-2 times per week

**Tier 2**: Small group intervention focused lessons 1-3 times per week **Tier 3**: One on one SEL intervention tailored to the needs of each student. 3-5 times per week

### **Physical Therapy-Gross Motor Program for Regulation**

This four-week Tier I Response to intervention program is provided by the physical therapist in the presence of the teacher and designed to equip all students with fundamental skills for motor control to assist attention to on-task behavior within the classroom.

Activities are presented by the therapist in a manner that makes them easy to integrate into routines. During the thirty-minute session, the therapist teaches the students and teacher how to apply the fundamental skills which are a necessary part of facilitating an environment for learning readiness.

The program includes but is not limited to: postural awareness, directionality, body awareness, movement regulation, sensory motor development, self-reliance, movement related learning/brain breaks, and behavior control . Home activities will be provided at each session. A baseline assessment (Planned Activity Check) will be completed with a therapist completing follow up assessment at 4 weeks. The teachers are provided the information about the activity check and how to use it to assess their students two more times during the school year.

## **Special Education - Safety Care**

### **Safety Care Initial Training**

Safety-Care® Behavioral Safety Training program is a two-day training that provides the skills and competencies necessary to effectively prevent, minimize, and manage behavioral challenges with dignity, safety, and the possibility of change. Safety-Care provides the tools you need to be safe when working with behaviorally challenging individuals. Using up-to-date and effective technologies from Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS), the Safety-Care program will provide your staff with strategies for preventing and managing behavioral challenges, and teaching replacement behaviors. Safety-Care promotes a positive reinforcement based approach, and the development of new skills, resulting in fewer restraints. Trainees who successfully pass the course will receive a Safety-Care™ training certificate. Recertification is required annually through a one-day recertification course.

Upon successful completion of the course, participants will maintain their certification for one full year. The one-day recertification course is required annually.

Participants will learn why reading is difficult, the connection between language and literacy and what the brain does when a person is reading. An overview of the skills that support proficient reading will be presented with examples of how children learn to read and spell.
