Our high school graduation rate continues to be Ninety percent (90%).



The ELECT Parenting Counselors provide individual and group sessions.



The ELECT Parenting Program helps students remain in school, obtain a diploma or a GED, and further their education or secure employment to become self-sufficient citizens.
